REV SUCCESS STORY: PASADENA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

Pasadena Unified School District consists of 29 school sites and 3 office locations. The District serves 18,200 students in Pasadena, Altadena and Sierra Madre with a staff of 3,000 employees. Pasadena USD has Prop 39 allocations for \$1,036,000 in year one.



PASADENA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT GOAL

Pasadena USD thought the Sustainability Circle would be a great opportunity to expand and take on more sustainable practices outside of energy that would complement their efforts. Pasadena USD had already taken on a number of initiatives to reduce energy since it was the largest cost to the district from a utilities standpoint.

ACTION PLAN HIGHLIGHTS

- An additional 10% reduction in energy use in 2 years (in addition to 20% reduction already achieved).
- Establish a Recycling Program district-wide within 3 years.
- All playing fields controlled by local weather stations in 3 years.
- Install Bike Racks at school sites in 2 years.
- Install Door Switches to control individual room compressors and/or fan coils in two years.
- Replace all exterior lighting with LEDs and upgrade controls.

RESULTS & BENEFITS

- Lighting Initiatives projected \$260K+ savings within 6 months.
- Letter of recognition from State Senator Carol Liu on energy saving accomplishment.
- Estimated savings of 900K+ kWh & 45,000 Therms annually from upgrade of Energy Management System.
- Expansion of turf removal program will create an 80% reduction in annual water use.
- Estimated \$17K annual cost savings from use of pool covers at school swimming pools.
